

COVID-19 UPDATE

March 12th, 2020

- With the number of new cases going down and the improvement of the general overview of the Covid-19 situation in Spain, Germany is set to lift the travel warning for parts of Spain and Portugal.
 - From March 14th Mallorca and the entire Balearic archipelago will no longer be considered risk areas for travel due to a vastly improved epidemiological situation there. The same goes for the regions of Extremadura, La Rioja and Castilla-La Mancha, costal regions of Valencia and Murcia and For the entire northern half of Portugal (Norte and Centro regions) including Porto.
 - The removal of these regions from the list means that travellers will no longer be required to take a test on their return to Germany, nor will they need to go into quarantine. However, there will still be rules like wearing masks and observing social distancing.

December 9th, 2020

- Spain is a safe destination, thanks to its "Covid-19 control" strict regulations and precautions. There are now two essential steps you need to check before your trip.
 - Passengers must complete an "FCS Health Control Form" at (https://www.spth.gob.es/). A QR code generated from the completed form must be presented upon arrival. Remember that you have to complete a separate form for each trip and each person
 - Passengers traveling from high-risk countries must submit a negative PCR or TMA test result (printed or digital) done 72 hours before the flight. October 27th, 2020

In late October, the Spanish government announced new Covid-19 safety measures including a night-time curfew. Nevertheless, production work is still authorised to continue throughout the day AND DURING curfew hours, following usual local permits requirements for each city and up to date health & safety measures.
